

# ARE YOU REGISTERED?

You must be registered at your current address. To check your registration, go to [vt.ncsbe.gov/RegLkup/](http://vt.ncsbe.gov/RegLkup/)

You can register online if you have a North Carolina driver's license. Go to [ncsbe.gov/voters](http://ncsbe.gov/voters) to see how.

---

The deadline for registration is Oct. 9, at 5 PM. However, you can still register at an Early Voting site, starting on Oct. 15. Simply bring proof of address with you. For details, go to [ncsbe.gov](http://ncsbe.gov) and look up "Register to Vote."

---

Students attending a college or university in Mecklenburg County can register with their school's address. Go to [mecknc.gov/BOE](http://mecknc.gov/BOE) to find the correct registration address.

## Five Important Facts

If you request an absentee ballot, you are not committed to voting by mail. As long as you do not submit the ballot you can still vote early or on Election Day. Simply dispose of your absentee ballot.

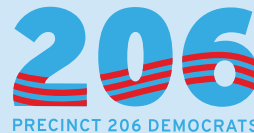
You can track your absentee ballot to make sure it has been received.

You may drop off your completed ballot at an Early Voting site during Early Voting.

Polling places will enforce social distancing and other safety measures, resulting in long lines. That's why an absentee ballot is an important part of a voting plan.

Curbside voting will be available during early voting and on Election Day.

# VOTE BY MAIL



Vote by Mail is the same as Absentee Voting.  
To vote by mail you need to do **four things**:

- 1** Get an Absentee-Ballot Request Form (ABRF). They're available online at [mecknc.gov/BOE](http://mecknc.gov/BOE)
- 2** Fill out and mail your ABRF to your county Board of Elections (address below)
- 3** When your ballot arrives, complete it in the presence of a single witness (anyone over 18; does NOT need to be a notary public)
- 4** Mail your signed and witnessed ballot to your county Board of Elections. PLEASE make sure your ballot is signed and sent well before Election Day!

You can request an absentee ballot RIGHT NOW! Your ballot will be mailed in early September. Request early so the Board of Elections can contact you if necessary.

# MAKE A PLAN TO VOTE

First: are you registered to vote?  
If not, see the back of this pamphlet.

There are two ways  
to cast your ballot:

Vote by Mail — Vote in Person



Having an absentee ballot is recommended  
in case voting is difficult in November.

As of July 15th 2020, you are NOT  
REQUIRED to show a photo ID to vote in NC.

# VOTE IN PERSON



One-Stop Early Voting (Oct. 15th- Oct. 31st)

During Early Voting, you can:

- Vote AND register at the same time!
- Change your voting address (if you've moved since you've last voted)

Vote on Election Day (Nov. 3rd)

On Election Day, you must vote at your  
precinct's designated polling place.

All in-person polling locations will offer  
Curbside Voting during early voting and  
on Election Day.
